#### RECOMMENDATION

- 1. the revised political composition of the Council be noted as follows:
  - Conservative Group: 17 Members;
  - West Devon Alliance Group: 12 Members;
  - Non-aligned Independents: 2 Members.
- 2. Cllr D Turnbull be appointed to serve on:
  - the Overview and Scrutiny Committee; and
  - the Communications & Media and People & Community Hub Advisory Groups; and
- **3.** Cllr N Jory be appointed to serve on the Standards Committee.

#### **1. Executive summary**

1.1 Cllr David Turnbull was elected to represent the Tavistock North Ward on the Borough Council at a By-Election held on 17 February 2022.

- 1.2 As a result, there are implications on both the political balance and, as a consequence, the appointments to formal Bodies of the Council.
- 1.3 This report requests that the Council amends the membership of some of its formal and informal Bodies to reflect the revised political balance;
- 1.4 These changes will be in place for the remainder of the 2021/22 Municipal Year (i.e. up to the Annual Council meeting to be held on 24 May 2022).

### 2. Background

- 2.1 The changes to the political composition of the Council are set out below and have had a consequential minor impact on the political balance table that requires addressing:
  - Conservative Group: 17 Members;
  - West Devon Alliance Group: 12 Members; and
  - Non-aligned Independents: 2 Members.
- 2.2 The Leader of Council has been invited to submit his nominations in line with the amended political balance table and these are set out below:
  - That Cllr D Turnbull be appointed to serve on:
    - the Overview and Scrutiny Committee; and
    - $\circ\;$  the Communications & Media and People & Community Hub Advisory Groups.
  - That Cllr N Jory be appointed to serve on the Standards Committee.

#### 3. Outcomes/outputs

3.1 The Council is asked to note its revised political composition and, with immediate effect, approve the consequent nominations to its formal Bodies and Hub Advisory Groups.

#### 4. Options available and consideration of risk

4.1 Failure to apply the rules of political balance could render a formal Member Body of the Council to be unlawful. However, this risk is mitigated by the revised nominations list.
